

ALIANMISAR Commitment



Narrative:

In Guatemala, as of December 2030, ALIANMISAR has conducted four (4) monitoring of first and second level health services in 2023, 2025, 2027 and 2030 to measure the accessibility and availability of family planning/contraceptive methods in the provision of sexual and reproductive health services for Mayan women to prevent maternal mortality and teenage pregnancies.

2. By 2030, ALIANMISAR will impact 530,000 adolescent, young and adult Mayan women in the departments of Chimaltenango, Quiche, Totonicapán, Quetzaltenango, San Marcos and Huehuetenango in training activities on the human rights of indigenous women for the defense, promotion and exercise of their sexual and reproductive rights, so that they can access health services with cultural relevance.

3. By 2030, ALIANMISAR will have advocated for the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Health to allocate resources to ensure the implementation of the Prevent through Education Charter and the Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) policy for adolescents and youth, for the benefit of the Mayan population of the departments of Chimaltenango, Quiche, Totonicapán, Quetzaltenango, San Marcos and Huehuetenango, in coordination with organizations that are working in the defense, promotion and exercise of the rights to comprehensive sexual and reproductive health, with attention to the rights of adolescents and youth, Quiche, Totonicapán, Quetzaltenango, San Marcos and Huehuetenango in coordination with the organizations that are working in the defense, promotion and exercise of the rights to sexual and integral health, with differentiated and quality attention to the adolescent and young population, for the prevention of teenage pregnancies.

4. By 2030, ALIANMISAR has lobbied the congressional commissions on women and indigenous peoples so that the Minister of Health presents an annual report on progress and limitations in the fulfillment of the sexual and reproductive rights of Mayan women with a focus on rights, gender and cultural relevance.

Outcomes:

1) By 2030, four (4) monitoring of health services to measure the accessibility and availability of family planning/ contraceptive supplies in the provision of sexual and reproductive health services for Mayan women to prevent maternal mortality and teenage pregnancies.

2) By 2030, 530,000 Mayan women strengthened in the defense, promotion and exercise of their sexual and reproductive rights.
