

Parkers Mobile Clinic Commitment



Narrative:

In Nigeria, we deliver family planning, comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services and SRHR education services at the doorstep of vulnerable women and children, especially those in South eastern, Nigeria using our movable clinic. So far, since our operation in 2019, we have been able to impact positively on the lives of over 1000 women. By 2030, we aim to use more innovative means to deliver SRHR services to women. The first measure we will take will be using social media platforms especially our facebook page to dispatch information on SRHR to women and girls in different parts of Nigeria. Secondly, we will partner with other NGOs and donors in order to secure funding and other resources which we need in order to reach out to as much women and girls as possible. We also want to work with lawyers to commence an advocacy movement for the legalization of safe abortion in Nigeria. We aim to impact positively on the SRHR and reproductive health of over 150,000 women and girls (through service delivery) in Southeast Nigeria by the end of 2030. We also aim to create an advocacy coalition which will fight to eliminate cultural, religious barriers, myths and beliefs associated with family planning. This will be done through sensitization of religious leaders and traditional leaders and direct advocacies and sensitizations in rural communities and religious groups. A core element of our service delivery is health education, health promotion and sensitization on different sexual and reproductive health issues. We use social media, especially Facebook through our Facebook page <https://www.facebook.com/parkershealth> to disseminate Information on family planning. We also train young people on family planning advocacy, demand generation and service delivery.

Outcomes:

The first outcome will be increased family planning and SRHR services accessibility for women and girls living in South-eastern, Nigeria.

The second outcome will be a decreased level of ignorance on family planning and SRHR due to cultural and religious factors among women and girls.

We use well designed indicators such as the ones below to keep track of the services we render.

1. Number of young people with access with the right information on SRHR and family planning
2. Number of women in remote and rural communities in our Target areas with access to family planning.
3. Number of young people with the right information on Gender based violence. 4. Number of young people trained on family planning advocacy, demand generation and service delivery.
