United Nations Population Fund Commitment



Narrative:

The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) commits to allocate at least 40 per cent of its indicative resources towards ending the unmet need for family planning annually over the course of 2022-2025 (approximately USD\$1.7 billionB over the four-year period). UNFPA also commits to leverage its global platform as the leading United Nations agency on sexual and reproductive health and rights and with its footprint in over 150 countries in support of FP2030 objectives, including through: (a) designation and engagement of UNFPA staff as FP2030 focal points within all commitment-making programme countries; (b) provision of technical assistance from global, regional and country- levels across the humanitarian, development and peace nexus; and (c) service on the FP2030 Governing Board and associated committees.

Baseline: In 2020, UNFPA spent approximately USD\$451.6 million (42.3% of UNFPA's total programme expenses) on family planning activities. In 2020, UNFPA served as the FP2020 Reference Group Co-Chair, Transition Oversight Group member agency and provided global political leadership and technical assistance to countries, including those facing humanitarian crises, across all six of its regions.

Outcomes:

By 2025, the reduction in the unmet need for family planning has accelerated. By 2025, UNFPA provides in-country leadership and technical assistance through services as FP2030 focal points in all commitment-making programme countries where UNFPA has a field footprint.
