





STEP 1: Identify key stakeholders and create a stakeholder engagement plan



Define a country commitment accountability approach

STEP 2: Secure buy-in from key decision makers



STEP 3: **Develop a comprehensive** commitment process roadmap

Draft a vision statement and set objectives

Share draft commitment for feedback

Country Government Commitments

Commitments launched: Benin, Burkina Faso, Ethiopia, Guinea, Kenya, Madagascar, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Rwanda, Senegal, Tanzania, Togo, and Uganda Commitments in finalization process: Cameroon, Chad, Cote d'Ivoire, India, Kyrgyz Republic, Mozambique, The Philippines, South Sudan, Vietnam, Zambia, Zimbabwe Commitments in drafting process: Bangladesh, Burundi, DRC, Ghana, Indonesia, Malawi, Nepal, Sierra Leone, the Gambia, and many others

Currently facilitating outreach with new and potential commitment-making countries, including in LAC.

Highlights of FP2030 Commitments

50+ Commitments from Non-Governmental Actors

Commitments from global-level actors: MSI Reproductive Choices, DKT, International Planned Parenthood Federation, FHI 360, International Confederation of Midwives, and more


Commitments from country-level CSOs/YLOs: Burundi, DRC, Uganda, Nigeria, Nepal, and LAC

Targeted outreach to donors, the private sector, faith, climate change, gender, disability rights groups.

Commitments amplification through FP2030 and global events.

FP2030 Key Actors – Country Focal Points

- Individuals representing the government (e.g. Ministry of Health), civil society, youth, and donor agencies designated in commitment-making countries.
- Focal Points as cornerstone of the partnership: Supporting governments for developing/executing a commitment in transparent, inclusive, and accountable ways.
- Focal Points convene partners and stakeholders in the country for consultation and inputs from the community
- CSO and Youth Focal Points provide the perspectives of the diversity of youth and civil society to the best of their ability, they are typically youth-led and local civil society organizations that focus on family planning





Advocacy, Accountability & Civil Society Engagement

Advocacy Priorities

1. Cultivating political will from governments and other stakeholders to support the fulfillment of their FP2030 commitments

2. Promoting the development and adoption of policies that support rights-based family planning

3. Increasing the allocation of domestic resources to family planning and related sectors at the national and sub-national levels

4. Improving the implementation of family planning policies and programs

Mutual Accountability Approach

While governments are responsible for delivering on the commitments they make, they cannot do it alone Collaborative approaches that depend on trust and goodwill between governmen ts and civil society

FP2030 ensures information on country progress is shared through annual reports and country updates

Implementing partners support the commitments by implementing programs consistent with national priorities

Donors support commitments through financial and technical assistance Civil society drives accountability by working with governments to monitor progress and advocate for action

Civil Society Engagement

- Global Advocacy: FP2030 collaborates with civil society partners to set the global family planning advocacy agenda and supports promotion of evidence and best practices among global advocates.
- **Country-level Advocacy:** FP2030 is driving country progress through mobilizing key civil society stakeholders and prioritizing advocacy opportunities to accelerate progress toward country commitments, including resource mobilization and policy change.
- **Monitoring and Accountability:** FP2030 enhances the role of CSOs in tracking FP2030 commitments and helping countries achieve their FP2020 goals.
- **Technical Capacity:** FP2020 connects CSOs with technical experts, mobilizes implementing partners, and identifies opportunities for cross-learning and strengthening FP programs.

Host Organization: Experience and profile

Experience

- Organizing regional and global gatherings
- Problem-solving and logistical support for successful meetings
- Advocacy and accountability in partnership with local CSOs and youth-led organizations

Host will provide:

- Back-office support financial oversight, administration, and human resource services
- Office space for 5-10 full-time staff

Profile

- Legal registration
- Committed to gender equity, social justice, advancing universal human rights and the SDGs
- Active in family planning, reproductive health or maternal & child health

Value to the host organization

- Retain a portion of the grant for its own administrative purposes
- Contribute to the FP2030 website and institutional documents
- Share credit for the successes of FP2030

Hub Staffing

Experts who understand regional and country-level SRHR landscape

- Managing Director
- Technical staff based on countries' needs and advocacy priorities in the region
- Resource mobilization capacity
- Advocacy, communications capacity
- Bilingual

Budget and Duration

- Initial period of 24 months
- Award of up to US\$900,000 per year, for the first two years
- Includes all fees, overhead and costs of providing the services
 - Accounting
 - Office equipment
 - Payroll and HR services
 - Office space
 - Legal services
- Starting date: 1 December 2022

Who Can Apply?

- Any LAC-based private NGO
- Philanthropic institutions and grant-making intermediaries
- For-profit entities with experience in SRH programs and partnerships
- A single entity, or a consortium of partners
- Spanish/English fluency
